

RE — Candlelight as a symbol: Advent and Diwali

Overview:

This half term within RE, we will be learning about how candlelight is used as a symbol within Christianity and Hinduism, focussing on Advent and Diwali. First, we will think about how candlelight makes us feel within certain situations. Then we will move onto learning about Advent within Christianity and how candlelight is used during this time. We will learn about Diwali and how candlelight is used as a symbol within Hinduism too. At the end, we will compare and contrast these two religions and traditions.
