



HOME LEARNING

Every Monday, your child will receive a new set of spellings. Children will have a week to learn their spellings.

We recommend practicing 3 x a week for 15 mins.

Weekly maths homework

We also encourage children to complete daily reading. If this is recorded in their Home Learning Journals, they will earn extra house points.

Enrichment grid – not essential but children will earn extra house points given by the teacher based on quality of task completed.

CONTINUING THE JOURNEY...

We work very closely with the Infant school team throughout the course of the academic year.

Transition starts for children with additional needs; the process for information sharing begins at the end of the Spring term (next April).

For all Year 2 children, we officially start transition in Summer 2: meetings between class teachers; handover from SENCo to SENCo; and a whole range of activities to ensure an informed, smooth and confident transition from the Infants to us:

- ☐ Our Year 3 teachers visit the children in their current classes to spend some time with them and read some books together
- ☐ Year 2 & 3 'Environment Day' Year 3 become the experts and together all the children complete a scavenger hunt in our wonderful grounds
- ☐ Year 2 & 3 picnic is held on the school field with both Infant and Junior staff there to support
- ☐ 'Shuffle Up' day in July whole school assembly, meeting the new teacher, introduction to the classroom
